

**International Boer Goat Association  
Sanctioned Show Rules**

The interest of the show rules is to provide fair competition to the exhibitors and their animals on a non-discriminating basis.

1. Eligibility - only animals registered in the recognized Association (International Boer Goat Assn., Inc., American Boer Goat Assn., Canadian Boer Goat Assn., The USBGA) may be shown in the official International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. sanctioned show. Only International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. registered animals may be awarded points. If animal is not International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. registered, owner has the option to register winning animals within five (5) business days with International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. and still be eligible to be awarded points. If winning animal is not International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. registered within allotted time, points will not be awarded.
2. The base date for computing ages for enteries shall be the date the animals are to be judged.
3. A registration certificate is required for all animals six (6) months or older.
4. A stamped duplicate or faxed duplicate application showing the date received by the International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. office is required on all animals under six (6) months of age.
5. A registration certificate may be required for animals of any age if the show so chooses.
6. No copies of registration or stamped duplicate of official registration certificates should be accepted by the show officials unless the animal is less than six (6) months of age.
7. The documents specified above as the requirements for that age animal to be shown must be presented to the Show Secretary for verification before the judging begins.
8. Proof of the ownership shall be the name on the registration document. Persons showing animals who registration certificates have signed transfers that have not be processed by the International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. office must show those animals as agent for the owner on International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. records.
9. An exhibitor that is showing an animal with a microchip as permanent identification is required to provide a microchip reader for verification of animal identity.
10. If an animal is registered in the International Boer Goat Assn., Inc. that registration number must be listed on the entry form.

**A health certificate must be presented at the time of registration for each animal to be entered. This certificate is valid for only 30 days.**
